



U-VISA Request Information

The Monterey County District Attorney's Office will review certifications in the following types of cases:

- Cases that have been reviewed by this office and charges have been filed (including cases where a warrant has been issued).

The Monterey County District Attorney's Office will **not** review certifications if the case was not referred to this office for review. The certification request should be directed to the law enforcement agency that took the report.

All requests for certification must be submitted with a copy of the law enforcement report. If you are unable to obtain the law enforcement report, please indicate the reason why you are unable to submit the report.

Current I-918B forms posted on the USCIS website (<https://www.uscis.gov/i-918>) must be completely and accurately filled out with the exception of the signature line and date. If the current I-918B is not used, required information is not provided, is incomplete, or filled out incorrectly, forms may be returned or rejected.

- Please do not include information about injuries not listed in the crime report i.e. applicant suffered emotional trauma and cannot sleep at night.
- If the reviewer does not agree with the information you have provided, changes may be made to the certification form. If any alteration is significant, you will be notified.
