**ELIGIBLE WORK**

Measures taken before, during and after a disaster to save lives, protect public health and safety, and protect improved public and private property. In order to be eligible, emergency protective measures for property must eliminate or lessen immediate threats of significant damage to improved public or private property through measures that are cost effective.

*Note: FEMA may require a certification by local, State and/or Federal officials that a threat exists, including identification and evaluation of the threat and recommendations of the emergency work necessary to cope with the threat.*

**ELIGIBLE COSTS**

**Category B: Emergency Protective Measures**

Emergency Protective Measures are actions taken before, during and after a disaster to save lives, protect public health and safety, and prevent damage to improved public and private property. This includes emergency response activities such as fires suppression, law enforcement and other essential assistance, emergency communications, emergency access, and emergency public transportation.

Examples of other eligible emergency protective measures applicable to this event are, but not limited to:

- Provision of food, water, ice and other essentials
- Security forces (police and guards)
- Provision of shelters or emergency care
- Bracing/shoring damaged structures
- Warning devices (barricades, signs, and announcements)
- Search and rescue
- Emergency repairs
- Emergency demolition
- Removal of health and safety hazards

**IMPORTANT APPLICATION INFORMATION**

Application packets must contain the following:

- Request for Public Assistance
- List of Projects (OES 95)
- Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution (OES 130) \*
- Project Application for Federal Assistance (OES 89) \*

\* *If you previously submitted a "Universal" OES 130 and OES 89 **and** your authorized representative has not changed, these forms are not required. If you have any questions regarding these forms, contact the OES Grant Processing Section at (916) 845-8110.*
