Status	Definition
APPEALED	Application has been appealed and is currently progressing through the appeal process.
APPLIED	Application has been submitted. An application should be in this status for no longer than 30 days. Pursuant to the Permit Streamlining Act, after 30 days a project should be deemed Complete or Incomplete.
CLEARED	Application is finished. Condition compliance is complete, no further action is needed.
COMPLETE	Application has been deemed complete for purposes of Permit Streamlining Act.
COND	Application has been approved and is in condition compliance.
CONTINUE	Hearing body has continued the application to a future date.
DENIED	Decision maker has denied the project.
EXPIRED	Permit has expired.
GVN_OUT	Application has been handed out.
INCOMP	Application has been deemed Incomplete for purposes of Permit Streamlining Act.
MONITOR	Application has been approved, but further monitoring is required.
NONE	Status unknown or not given.
PREAPP	Applicant has submitted for a formal pre-application review pursuant to Planning and Building Inspection Dept. procedures and fees.
REFER	Hearing body has referred application to another hearing body with recommendation.
REQUEST	Applicant has requested a Planning permit application.
REVOKED	Permit has been revoked.
SET	Application has been set for first hearing.
SUSPEND	After no action on an application for 2 years, it goes to SUSPEND status.
TABLED	Hearing body has delayed action on the application
VOID	Application Initialized in error
WITHDRAW	Applicant has requested that the application be withdrawn from consideration.
