## **SALINAS MAN FACES 59 YEARS TO LIFE IN PRISON AFTER JURY FINDS HIM GUILTY OF MOLESTING THREE GIRLS**

Monterey County District Attorney Dean D. Flippo announced today that a jury found Salinas resident Ernest Vega Morales, age 46, guilty of molesting three girls. Morales faces a maximum of 59 years to life in prison. The week and a half long jury trial was presided over by Judge Julie R. Culver. Morales will be sentenced on April 14, 2016.

The jury found Morales guilty of all counts, enhancements and special allegations with which he was charged, which included sexual penetration of a child 10 or under, forcible lewd acts on a child, four counts of lewd acts on a child, two counts of criminal threats, two counts of dissuading a witness by force or fear, and a special allegation that Morales committed sex offenses against multiple child victims. Under California's Three Strikes Law, Morales' convictions will constitute 10 "strikes". He will also have to register as a sex offender for life.

The oldest victim, now an adult, testified that Morales molested her in his trailer when she was 7 years old in July 2004. He was the neighbor of her relative. The second victim, now 11, testified that between 2012 and 2013 Morales, her neighbor, molested her on two occasions when she was 8 and threatened that if she disclosed what he was doing he would kill her family. The youngest victim, now 10, testified that when she was 8 years old in 2013 her neighbor, Morales, picked her up from the yard where she was playing with a friend, took her to a more secluded location, and forcibly molested her. When she told him that she would tell her mom what he was doing, he told her that if she told anyone, he would kill her family. The girl did not disclose the molest to her mother until March 2015 after Morales had moved away.

Both minor victims were assisted by the District Attorney's service dog Odie when they testified.
