SEASIDE MAN RECEIVES 8-YEAR SENTENCE FOR DRUG SALES

Monterey County District Attorney Dean D. Flippo announced today that Rogillo Ensoy Mamon, age 52 of Seaside, was sentenced to eight years in custody following his guilty plea to possessing and transporting methamphetamine for purposes of sales.

Mamon was first arrested on May 3, 2016, by detectives who pulled over a vehicle he was driving in the city of Monterey. When searched, Mamon was in possession of several plastic baggies containing a total of 20.9 grams of methamphetamine, and a digital scale with residue on it.

On May 26, while Mamon was out on bail on the first arrest, detectives performed a probation search on his residence in Seaside. Inside his bedroom, they found 8.5 grams of methamphetamine in several small plastic baggies, \$769.00 in cash, a police scanner, a counterfeit \$20 bill, and a black bag containing burglary tools.

Mamon, who has three prior narcotics sales convictions, was sentenced by Monterey Superior Court Judge Carrie Panetta to a total of eight years. He will serve four years in county jail before he is released on mandatory supervision for the balance of his term.

Mamon's cases were investigated by the Peninsula Regional Violence and Narcotics Team.
