## **MONTEREY WOMAN FOUND GUILTY OF DELAYING, RESISTING, AND OBSTRUCTING A PROBATION OFFICER WITHIN THE CITY OF SALINAS**

Monterey County District Attorney Dean D. Flippo announced today that on November 9, 2016, Lisa Adrian, age 56, was found guilty by jury of delaying, resisting, and obstructing a probation officer within the City of Salinas. The case was heard by Monterey County Superior Court Judge Stephanie Hulsey.

On June 23, 2016, at approximately 2:30 p.m., Adrian accompanied her 25-year-old son who was on probation to the Monterey County Probation Department in Salinas in an attempt to sign up for the supervised home confinement program to serve a 40 day jail sentence. When told that he needed a court order to be able to smoke medical marijuana while on probation, and that he could not use marijuana while on home confinement, he decided to decline the program which is voluntary. Adrian then became upset at this information and demanded to speak to a supervisor. The supervisor informed her that individuals on home confinement are serving a jail sentence and are not allowed to use controlled substances or alcohol while in the program. Adrian then became irate and refused to leave the probation department when asked to do so several times, stating "I'm not leaving, you're going to have to arrest me." She was subsequently arrested and booked into the Monterey County Jail.

The defendant was sentenced by Judge Hulsey to three years of probation and will serve 20 days in the county jail.

The case was investigated by Monterey County Probation Officers Michael McNew and Christopher Plummer.
