MISSOURI WOMAN RECEIVES 5 YEAR PRISON SENTENCE FOR ARMED ROBBERY

Monterey County District Attorney Dean D. Flippo announced today that Missouri resident Jayme Wilson, age 27, entered pleas of no contest to four counts of armed robbery.

The robberies occurred from January 15, 2016 to February 7, 2016 at several local restaurants and gas stations in Salinas. Wilson was the get-away driver for her boyfriend, Terry Jacobs, who used a small silver handgun and wore burkas to hold up the clerks of these several establishments. Jacobs is currently being held on federal charges for a string of robberies stretching from Missouri to Salinas. Wilson will face federal charges, as well, as she was an accomplice in each of these robberies.

Wilson received a prison sentence of 5 years in state prison. She was sentenced on December 8, 2016 before the Monterey County Superior Court Judge Larry E. Hayes.

The case was investigated by Salinas Police Department Officers Arlene Currier, Jeffrey Munoz, Mitchell Eggers, Nicholas Grave, David Pritt, and Gabriela Garibay, as well as FBI Agents Timothy Flohrschutz and Christopher Castillo.
