SALINAS WOMAN SENTENCED TO 2 YEARS IN PRISON FOR PROBATION VIOLATION

Monterey County District Attorney Dean D. Flippo announced today that Jeanette Rojas, age 35 of Salinas, was sentenced to 2 years in prison for violating her probation.

On February 17, 2014, Greenfield Police Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for failing to signal a turn. Rojas was the driver of the vehicle. A search of the vehicle yielded 3.6 grams of methamphetamine, a digital scale, two cellphones and cash. Rojas admitted that she sold the methamphetamine from time to time.

On July 1, 2014 Rojas was sentenced to 3 years of formal probation. She violated her probation by continuing to use methamphetamine, and possessing methamphetamine on multiple different occasions.

Monterey County Superior Court Judge Julie R. Culver sentenced Rojas to 2 years in prison which will be served in the county jail due to Realignment.
