SANTA CLARA MAN SENTENCED TO 7 YEARS PRISON FOR FALSE IMPERSONATION

Monterey County District Attorney Dean D. Flippo announced today that on April 7, 2017, Santa Clara resident Angelo Amir Henry, age 27, was sentenced today after being convicted by a jury of false impersonation and driving on a suspended license.

The incident occurred in March 2016, at the Monterey Regional Airport. Henry failed to stop at a stop sign and when he was contacted by police, he gave the name of Ismael Pugh, a friend of his. He maintained that his name was Pugh through many questions by the officer and signed his name as Pugh on a traffic citation for not having a driver's license in his possession. A jury returned a verdict of guilty on all counts.

The court found that Henry had three felony strike priors.

The Honorable Pamela Butler sentenced Henry to the upper term of 3 years, doubled for the prior strikes, for a total of 6 years. Henry received an additional year for violating his grant of felony probation. Henry will serve his seven year sentence in state prison.

The case was investigated by Monterey Peninsula Airport District Police Department Officers Alfred Porter and Gary Anderson.
