### Statement of Enforcement of Local Rabies Control Activities

This Statement of Enforcement of Rabies Control Activities is for the county that is named above and is declared by the Director of the California Department of Public Health as a "Rabies Area", effective January 1, 2015.

In accordance with Section 121690 of the California Health and Safety Code and Section 2606.4 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 17, the following statutory and regulatory programs must have continued enforcement in any county designated by the Director of CDPH as a "rabies area":

- Mandatory licensure of all dogs four months of age and older
- Maintenance of current rabies vaccination status for all dogs four months of age and older, excepting a maximum 12-month exemption as approved by the local health officer
- Confinement at home or secured by physical restraint of all dogs that are under four months of age or exempted from rabies vaccination
- Maintenance of a rabies control program, to include an animal shelter system, animal bite reporting and investigation, stray animal control, animal rabies case investigation, quarantine of biting dogs and cats, and quarantine of domestic animals potentially exposed to rabies
- Provision of vaccination clinics with rabies vaccination fee not to exceed the "actual cost" established by CDPH.
- Reporting of local rabies control activities to CDPH
