### **20-YEAR-OLD MADERA MAN PLED GUILTY TO NINE COUNTS OF INAPPROPRIATE SEXUAL CONDUCT WITH SEVEN MINORS**

*People v. Angel Vasquez; 19CR004180*

SALINAS, California- Monterey County District Attorney Jeannine M. Pacioni announced today that on May 30, Angel Vasquez, age 20, a resident of Madera, pled guilty to eight counts of unlawful sexual intercourse with a minor, one count of oral copulation with a minor, and one count of violating a court order. There was a total of seven minor victims.

Between 2017 and 2018, Vasquez engaged in sexual intercourse with seven minor females who were between 14-years-old to 17-years-old, when Vasquez was between 18 and 19 years of age. Vasquez impregnated four of the minors, however three minors had miscarriages. Furthermore, after Judge Mark E. Hood ordered Vasquez not to have any contact with the seven minors, Vasquez continued to contact three minors.

Judge Hood will sentence Vasquez on July 18, 2019. He faces up to four years and four months in prison. In addition, he will be required to register as a sex offender.

The case was investigated by Detective Sergeant Hoskins and Deputy Galvan from the Monterey County Sheriff's Office, Officer Tyler from the Soledad Police Department, and Officer Mora from the Gonzalez Police Department. The seven victims were assisted by District Attorney Victim Advocate Mayra Sandoval.
