

Award Eligibility Criteria 2020

Talcott Bates Award:

Given to a person who has made significant and continuing contributions to the community in the prevention of child abuse.

Child Abuse Prevention Council Award:

Given to an individual or a group who has contributed significantly to the development or enhancement of the Council's goals, activities or events.

Community Peace Award:

Given by the Child Abuse Prevention Council to an individual or an organization that has demonstrated an understanding of the importance of working with youth who are at risk or victims of child abuse or neglect due to community violence.

Children and Youth Award:

Given to a youth that has made a significant contribution to the community, CAPC, or to other youth. A \$250 prize from CAPC's Eugene Eldredge Youth Fund accompanies this award.

The Eugene Eldredge Community Service Award:

Given to an individual or service club that has made a significant contribution in the area of child abuse prevention.

Front Line Award:

Given to individuals providing direct services to families and children who are victims of child abuse and neglect or at risk of abuse.

Social Services Award:

Given by the Child Abuse Prevention Council to a Social Services individual or organization for their contribution on behalf of children who are at risk or victims of child abuse or neglect.

Lifetime Achievement Award

Given by the Child Abuse Prevention Council to an individual who has dedicated his/her life work to the prevention of child abuse and neglect.
