



Cultural Complexities in Engagement, Assessment & Diagnosis

Target Audience: Licensed & License Eligible Professionals who write Universal Psychosocial Assessments .

Course Description:

In this training, a cultural framework for all who seek mental health services will be presented. This framework for systematically addressing individual, family and community needs will lead to a formal process to provide assessment and arrive at diagnoses and move to successful cultural engagement. The DSM-IV TR and V Cultural Formulation, through the lens of one of its primary authors and advocates, will be presented along with clinical vignettes that will enrich its use. In addition to practical information provided to attendees, there will be practical application exemplified through videotape materials, written clinical descriptions, & potential role plays.

As participants, we will learn to:

- 1) Identify clinical & ethical reasons (at least 3) for integrating cultural competence into assessment, diagnosis, engagement & treatment;
- 2) List the five (5) core components of the DSM-IV TR and V Outline for Cultural Formulation.
- 3) Articulate ways in which learning related to the DSM-IV TR and V Cultural can be structurally continued in ongoing mental health services.



Dr. Matthew R. Mock, PhD, has a private clinical and consulting practice in Berkeley, California. He is also a professor of psychology and an award winning national and international trainer. Through his teaching activities, he is helping develop the “next generation” of diverse mental health providers. Dr. Mock was the Director of the Family, Youth, Children’s and Multicultural Service, City of Berkeley Mental Health Division for twenty years. He went on to serve as the Director for the Center of Multicultural Development with the California Institute for Mental Health. He has consulted, trained or provided services in over 45 of California’s 58 counties.
