

**SUPPLEMENT TO THE MAY 26, 2020, ORDER OF THE MONTEREY
COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER DIRECTING ALL INDIVIDUALS LIVING
IN THE COUNTY TO CONTINUE SHELTERING AT THEIR PLACE OF
RESIDENCE, AND RELAXING RESTRICTIONS ON CERTAIN
BUSINESSES AND ACTIVITIES CONSISTENT WITH DIRECTION
FROM THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

DATE OF SUPPLEMENT: JUNE 11, 2020

Please read this Order carefully. Violation of or failure to comply with this Order is a misdemeanor punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both. (California Health and Safety Code § 120295, *et seq.*; Cal. Penal Code §§ 69, 148(a)(1); Cal. Gov. Code § 8665)

SUMMARY OF ORDER: Existing community transmission of the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) in Monterey County continues to present a significant risk of harm to the health of county residents. Evidence suggests that restrictions and requirements imposed by prior Health Officer Orders have slowed the rate of increase of COVID-19 community transmission and related hospitalizations by limiting person-to-person interactions. On May 26, 2020, the Monterey County Health Officer issued a new Shelter-in-Place Order which aligns the County Health Officer Shelter-in-Place order with applicable State Orders to fully join the State in Stage 2 and continue to move with the State through Stages 3 and 4 of the State COVID-19 Resilience Roadmap. The May 26 Order provides for limited and measured steps to reopen certain industry sectors with modifications that keep a low incidence of person-to-person contact and ensure continued social (physical) distancing and adherence to other infection control measures. This Order requires industry sectors that are allowed to reopen to implement California Resilience Roadmap COVID-19 Statewide Industry Guidance as set forth by the California Department of Public Health and other State agencies. Adherence to the Guidance will continue to limit person-to-person contact and ensure continued social distancing and other infection control measures in the workplace and in the community.

UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTIONS 101040, 101085, AND 120175, THE HEALTH OFFICER OF THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY (“HEALTH OFFICER”) ORDERS:

1. This Supplement is effective as of June 12, 2020 and shall remain in effect as long as the May 26, 2020 Order is in effect.
2. All industry sectors allowed by the State of California to open statewide or with Monterey County attestation and that are approved to reopen by the Monterey County Health Officer, are, at a minimum, required to implement California Resilience Roadmap COVID-19 Statewide Industry Guidance as set forth by the California Department of Public Health and

other State agencies. The Monterey County Health Department (MCHD), may issue local guidance for industry sectors, and, in such cases, the industry sectors must follow MCHD guidance in addition to the State guidance. In the event of a discrepancy between State and MCHD guidance, the more restrictive guidance provision shall control. Industry Guidance may be found at State of California Resilience Roadmap webpages at WWW.COVID19.CA.GOV.

3. Copies of this Supplement shall promptly be: (1) made available at the County Government Center at 168 West Alisal Street, CA 93901 and the County Health Department at 1270 Natividad Rd., Salinas CA 93906; (2) posted on the County Health Department website www.mtyhd.org; and (3) provided to any member of the public requesting a copy of this Supplement.

4. If any provision of this Supplement, or its application to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, the remainder of this Supplement and the May 26, 2020 Order, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, the provisions of this Supplement are severable.
